**Main idea:** The garments and consecration of Aaron and his sons reveal even more about God's character, His way of salvation, and His will for the "royal priesthood" of believers in Christ.

IX. **The priests offered continual, daily sacrifices (29:38-44)**

a. Ephesians 5:1, 2

b. Hebrews 7:26, 27

Type of Offering	Purpose
Burnt offering (Lev. 1:1-17; 6:8-13)	Atonement for sin in general, enabling an unholy people to approach a holy God
Grain offering (Lev. 2:1-16; 6:14-23)	An expression of thanksgiving and dedication to the Lord
Peace (fellowship) offering (Lev. 3:1-17; 7:11-38)	An expression of gratitude and desire for fellowship with God. Worshippers participated in a communal meal as a part of the offering.
Sin offering (Lev. 4:1-5:13; 6:24-30)	Atonement for specific sins committed unintentionally out of weakness or carelessness
Guilt (trespass) offering (Lev. 5:14-6:7; 7:1-10)	Atonement for specific sins; injured persons compensated for their losses
Wave offering (Lev. 7:28-34)	A symbolic act indicating that the offering was for the Lord. Portions of the things offered were literally waved in the air before the Lord. A wave offering was a portion of a sacrifice presented to God, then released by God for the use of those involved in the sacrifice. The meat fed the families of the priests.
Drink offering (Lev. 23:13)	A sacrificial offering of wine poured out at the foot of the altar, to accompany a burnt, fellowship or grain offering.
